The outlook for the global economy in the near- to medium-term remains uncertain due to several factors, including geopolitical risks, concerns around global growth and price stability. Risks to growth and stability stem mainly from



	<p><b>operates:</b></p>	<p>continued imbalances in Europe and elsewhere, low growth levels in foreign markets and conflicts in Ukraine and the Middle East.
