B.2	The domicile and legal form of the Issuer, the legislation under which the Issuer operates and its country of incorporation:	BNG Bank is a public company with limited liability (<i>naamloze vennootschap</i>) incorporated under the laws of the Netherlands, having its statutory seat at The Hague, the Netherlands. BNG Bank is registered in the trade register of the Netherlands Chamber of Commerce under no. 27008387.
B.4b	A description of any known trends affecting the Issuer and the industries in which it operates:	<p>BNG Bank's business and results of operations are affected by local and global economic conditions, perceptions of those conditions and future economic prospects. More than five years after the beginning of the global economic and financial crisis, the world economy is showing signs of recovery in 2014, but downward revisions to growth forecasts in some economies highlight continued fragilities and downside risks. Risks to growth and stability stem mainly from continued imbalances – among and within countries – and from uncertainty about how economies will respond as the extraordinary monetary policy measures, including the quantitative easing programs, implemented during the global financial and economic crisis are unwound. Although the prospects for the Dutch economy in 2014 are moderately favorable, the economy in the Netherlands remains weak.</p> <p>BNG Bank's business is impacted generally by the business and economic environment in which it operates, which itself is impacted by factors such as changes in interest rates, securities prices, credit and liquidity spreads, exchange rates, consumer spending, business investment, real estate valuations, government spending, inflation, the volatility and strength of the capital markets and other de-stabilising forces such as geopolitical tensions or acts of terrorism.</p> <p>The introduction of, and changes to, taxes, levies or fees applicable to BNG Bank's operations (such as the imposition of a financial transactions tax and bank levy) could have an adverse effect on its business and/or results of operations.</p> <p>Although it is difficult for BNG Bank to predict what impact all of the recent regulatory changes, developments and heightened levels of</p>

		scrutiny will have on BNG Bank, the enactment of legislation and regulations in the Netherlands, changes in other regulatory requirements and the transitioning to direct supervision by the ECB, have resulted in increased capital and liquidity requirements and/or increased operating costs and have impacted, and are expected to continue to impact, BNG Bank's business.

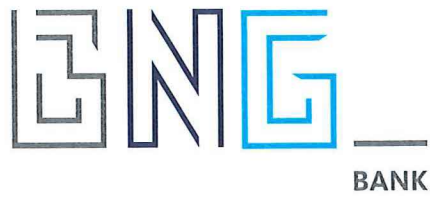
